What: Quality 4.0 and the Future of Manufacturing: It's All About the Data

Although the internet accelerated innovation in the late 1990's and early 2000's, we are just now approaching the cusp of the fourth industrial revolution. New technologies to enhance connectedness, intelligence, and automation (like cloud computing, machine learning, and the internet of things) are being introduced to operations at a rapid pace.
