- PressRelease: Supplier Auditing, Certification and Nonconformances Seminars Coming in April, 2011:

The ASQ Customer-Supplier Division announces their one-day seminars for April 2011. The very popular Supplier Auditing and Supplier Certification courses and the NEW Supplier Nonconformances course will be offered in the Jersey area: Plainview, LI NY (Apr 18-20), Princeton, NJ (Apr 19-21), Allentown, PA (Apr 20-22), and Vineland, NJ (Apr 21-23).

"Because each city in the cluster is within driving distance, we schedule them one day after the other," says Supplier Certification instructor Dick Gould. "We call them our Roadshows. We've been doing this for about 10 years, but each cluster is different. We try to serve all major metropolitan areas within the USA within a reasonable time period. The addition of Supplier Nonconformances, taught by Kathryn Roberts, makes this event even more valuable."

Supplier Auditing instructor Dennis Arter says, "Our data tell us that CSD members want useful training that is focused, short, local, and inexpensive. These are practical courses lasting a single day. We come to you and keep the price down. Our courses attract ASQ members and non-members who can't afford to take an entire week off work. Often, they take a vacation day to attend. They want something useful that will benefit themselves and their organization."

- **Bylaws Amendment Needs Member OK**

On February 16, 2011, the ASQ board of directors approved recommendations to simplify and improve board governance. The changes will affect the officer titles, number of officers, and the name of the office of the president. **These changes to the officer titles are subject to membership approval.**

The recommendations came from the board's work with Brown Governance, a governance firm brought in to assist the board to identify improvement opportunities.

The office of the president will be referred to as the **executive council**. This change will better describe the officers' functions, as well as better align the executive council officers with the ASQ board members. Neither the office of the president nor the executive council have decision, policy, or budget authority. That remains unchanged.

The official titles of the executive council will also change, subject to the approval of the membership. The table below lists the proposed titles in the first column, along with the current titles in the second column.

Food Safety Requirements

The Food Safety and Modernization Act and other new related legislation have introduced requirements that may impact your QA/QC processes. Some of the changes include:

1. Increased inspection of 80% of the largest egg facilities
2. Increased inspection of foreign food facilities
3. Requirements for companies to have active food safety plans in place
4. Increased requirements for company reporting and traceability
5. Mandatory recall authority for the U.S. FDA.



"Everyone along the farm-to-table continuum is responsible for safety in our food supply, including producers, processors, manufacturers and retailers," suggests [Dr. Rene Massengale](#), professor of biotechnology at Harrisburg University. "Training and certifications are important steps in preparing to meet these requirements."

• **Book Review**

Sustainable Business and Industry: Designing and Operating for Social and Environmental Responsibility

Joseph Jacobsen

This book is an introduction to developing and implementing a successful program in the domain of sustainability and social responsibility. The reader is exposed to financially, environmentally, and socially responsible objectives that are supported by strategies and achieved by clear tactics that have measurable outcomes.

The reader is introduced to methods of implementing technologies and practices and will also learn how to measure the consequent social and environmental performance for written reports and persuasive presentations. This book also reveals why we should be sustainable by explaining seemingly complex topics in science in a way that requires very little math or science background. The overview also captures how sustainability and social responsibility can be the source of process and product innovation.

This book's approach is practical yet scientific. The nine chapters are dedicated to the practice of environmental and social responsibility in ways that achieve financial stability over the long run. As a result, these chapters help us understand not just why businesses need to be more responsible but how businesses can be more successful over the long run.

International standards are given full treatment. ISO 26000 is given detailed attention, slightly more than ISO 9000 or ISO

14000, because it melds guidance on both environmental and social responsibility into one general concept of social responsibility. This book also specifies how to use traditional methods such as Six Sigma, lean, and operations research to improve processes, reduce resource use and waste, and make better social and environmental decisions that are based upon data from key financial, social, and environmental performance indicators. Internal and external data sourcing are given full treatment along with basic statistical data management. A recurring theme throughout the book is the integration of traditional methods of continuous improvement applied to social and environmental data sources.

What: Leaning Out the Six Sigma Problem-Solving Process

Since the inception of the traditional 6-sigma methodology, there have been numerous attempts to package the DMAIC model. Many package the methodology and tailor it using their own terminology. Some integrated the use of Lean tools into the structure to try and capture the attention of the so-called six-sigma disbelievers. Often times the methodology is constructed at the Black Belt Level and parsed down to the lower levels of Green Belt and Yellow Belts. This causes a perception that it is more complex than it has to be. The results are longer projects, lost savings opportunities and higher drop-out rates for Yellow and Green Belt Certifications.

The LOSS Model is targeted for the basics and provides a distinct novel flow for the Six Sigma Novice without the fluff.

Who: Dewey Butts

Since 2003, Dewey Butts has been working with the Harley-Davidson Motor Company as a Continuous Improvement Resource in the York, PA Vehicle Assembly facility. As a certified Lean Six Sigma Master Black Belt, he is responsible for training, mentoring and coaching Harley-Davidson employees in the Lean and Six Sigma methodologies. He also applies his skills and services in the application to project work associated with quality and performance improvements in products and processes. Prior to relocating to York, PA, Dewey worked at the Harley-Davidson facility in Kansas City where he joined the company in 2001. There he applied his quality training and six sigma skills supporting both the Fabrication and Assembly processes.

Dewey holds a Masters Degree in Business from Baker University, Overland Park KS and Bachelor of Science in Industrial Technology with Quality Emphasis from Buffalo State College, Buffalo, NY.

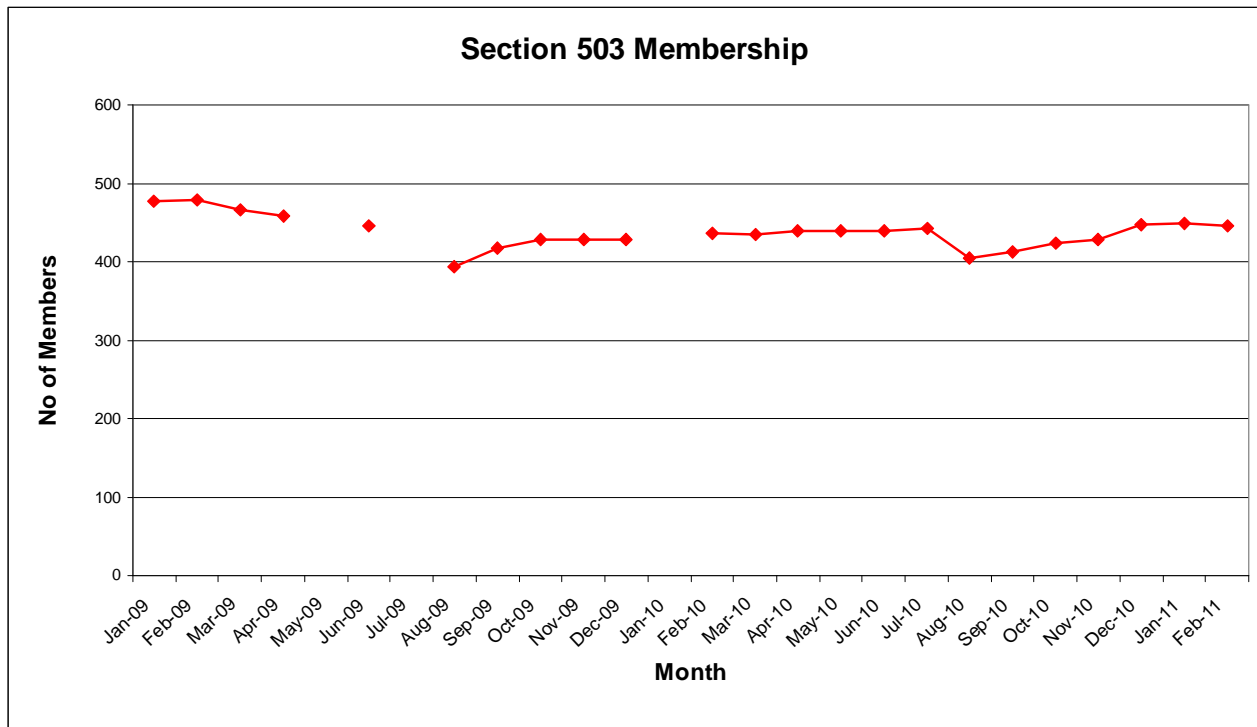

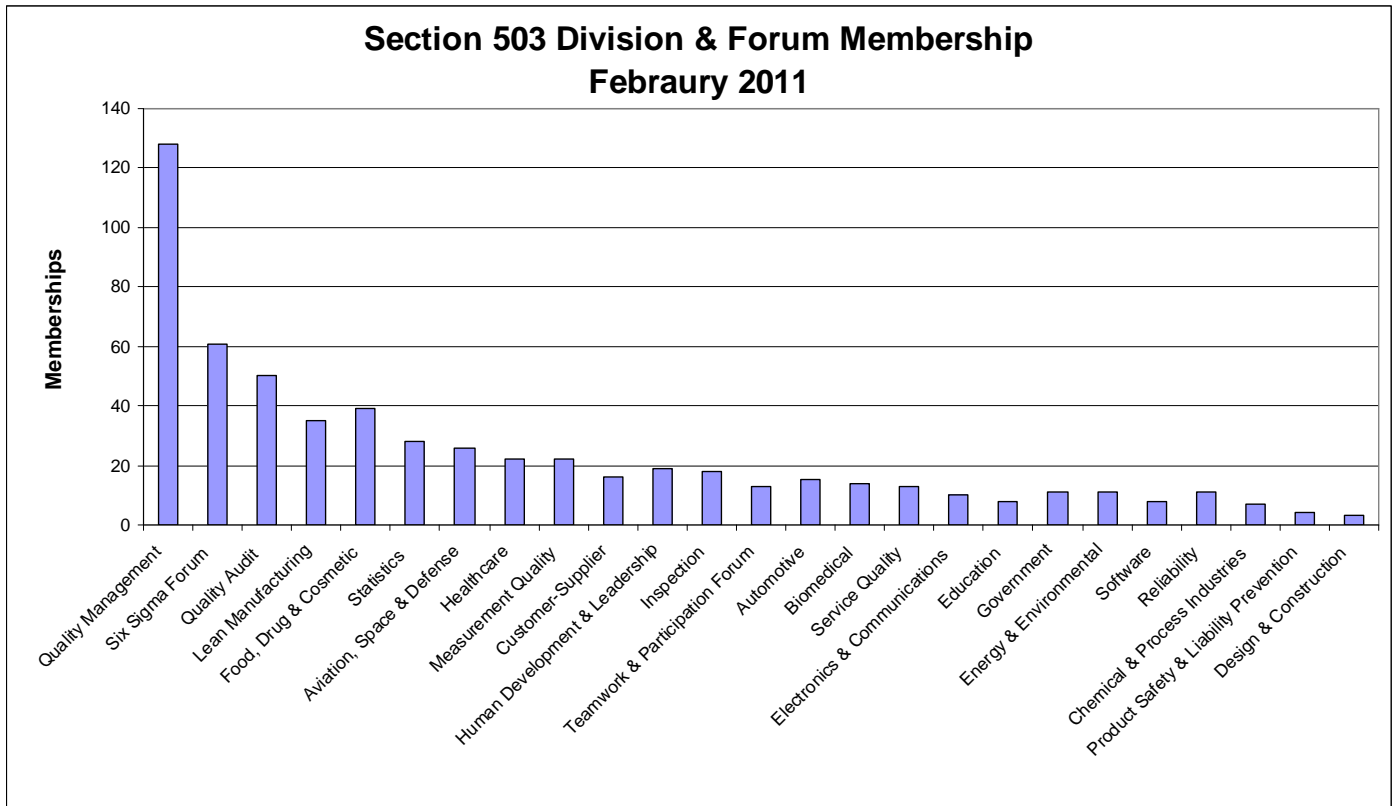

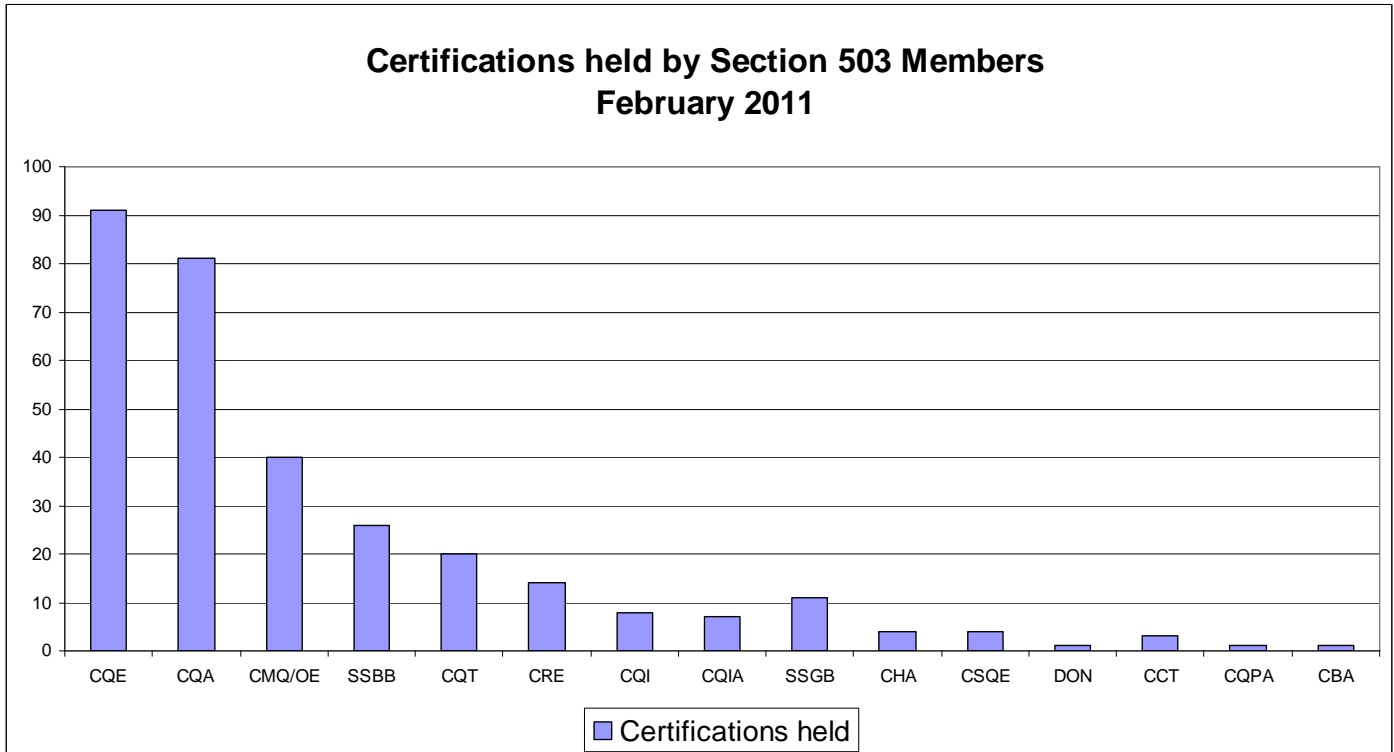
